TLC organized a one-day workshop on 6th March 2020 entitled "Managing Personal Psyche Through Personality." The workshop was conducted by Dr. Husni Mohd Radzi from Talent Enrichment and Student Care, Student Affairs Department. There were 32 participants attending the short course.

Among the objectives of the workshop were to get the participants to know their personal psyche via perception and current habits. In addition, the workshop exposed the participants on how to manage stress via some practical exercises.

Dr. Husni guided the participants on interpreting the house-tree-person (HTP) personality test in which ambiguous, abstract or unstructured stimuli convey our main personality characteristics and traits. She also taught how observing birthdate via numerical patterns effects one's personality using the nine Life Path numbers.

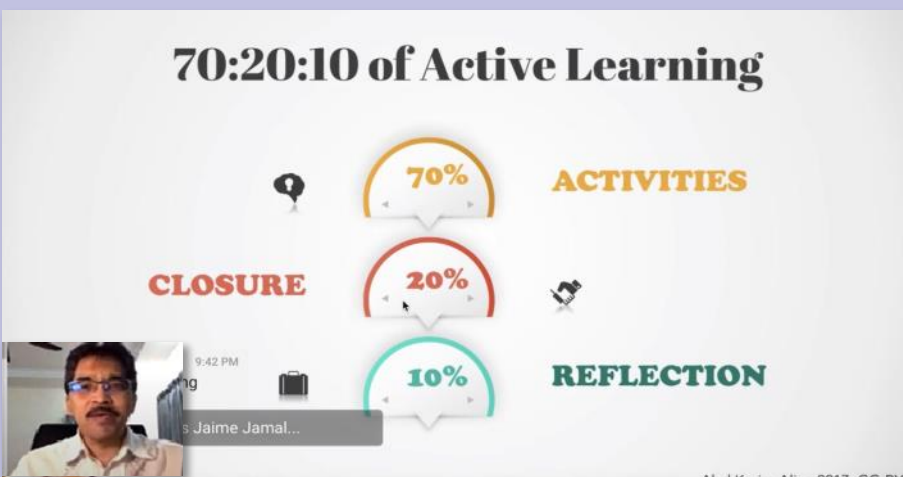
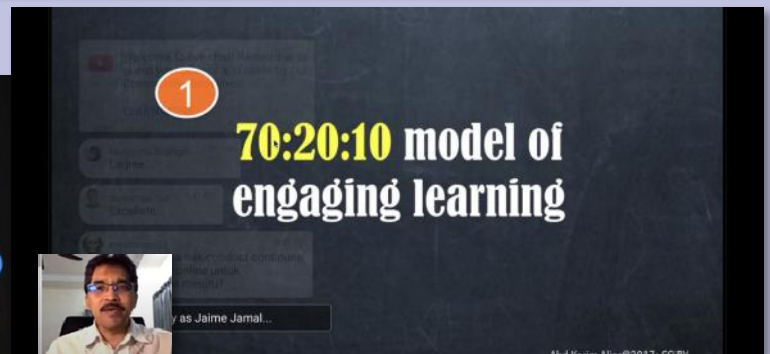
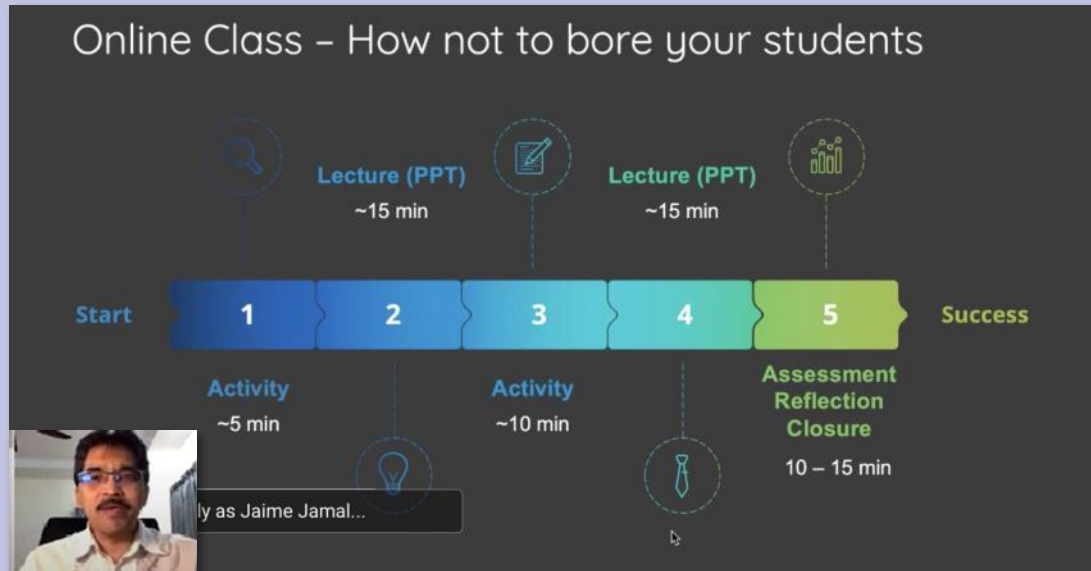

The defence available to the student is that it is for education and they are not making any profit.

Furthermore, there are many lawyers outside there wiloining to defend the students on pro bono basis.

A webinar on best practices was hosted by Prof. Dr. Abdul Karim Alias (USM) with Mr. Adam Brimo (Group CEO of OpenLearning) and Mr. Sarveen Kandiah (MD Malaysia of OpenLearning) on 31st March 2020 via YouTube Live.

Prof. Karim elaborated on the major components of creating a successful online learning which are content (design and development, delivery, copyright, instructional strategies, assessment), earners (readiness, expectation, accessibility, learning style, digital literacy) and teachers (changing the role, transition to online, skillset, interest, teaching style). Next, they discussed the readiness for online learning.
